All students are required to read Outliers by Malcolm Gladwell (Vintage).

<u>DIRECTIONS</u>: While written work will be completed in the fall, we ask that **you mark important or noteworthy passages with post-it notes**, strips of paper, or highlighter. If you use an **E-book version**, please highlight and SAVE marked passages.

Six to eight passages per book is a guideline, but you may have more. An important passage could illustrate a central idea or theme explored in the book. Examples of powerful or interesting writing also count as "noteworthy" passages.
