## Mission

Thornton Academy offers a rigorous and broad-based program of academic, arts, and athletic opportunities that challenges students to reach their potential. Our graduates are lifelong learners who are prepared to be productive participants in a changing world.

## Historic Independent School

Thornton Academy is a historic, independent school educating 6-12th graders in Saco, Maine. Founded in 1811 and chartered by the Commonwealth of Massachusetts,
Thornton Academy is one of New England's oldest independent schools. The upper school's population of 1477 students come from diverse geographic, economic, and ethnic backgrounds. Students enroll as: 1) day students who come by municipal contract from public schools in the towns of Saco, Dayton, and Arundel, 2) day students from other towns in southern Maine who apply as tuition students, or 3) residential students who apply from other states and countries. (Day students comprise $86.5 \%$ of the student body, while $13.5 \%$ of the student body comes from more than 30 different countries.)

## Accreditation/Affiliation

Thornton Academy is accredited by the New England Association of Schools \& Colleges (NEASC). Affiliations include: National Association of Independent Schools (NAIS), The Association of Boarding Schools (TABS), Independent School Association of Northern New England (ISANNE), Maine Association of Independent Schools (MAIS), the College Board, and is a SEVIS certified school.

Curriculum, Credits, and Grading
Four-year upper school students complete 22 credits to satisfy graduation requirements, including: English (4), Mathematics (3), Social Science (3), Science (3), Wellness (1.5), Fine Arts (1), and Electives (6.5).

College-bound students are highly encouraged to take a minimum of three years of the same foreign language.

International students who study less than four years must meet the following minimum requirements: 1 year student- 6 credits to include: English, Math, Science, US History, and 2 additional credits; 2 year student-11 credits to include: 2 English, 2 Math, 2 Science, 1 US History, 1 Wellness and/or Art, and 3 additional; 3 year student- 16 credits including: 3 English, 3 Math, 3 Science, 1 US History, 1 Social Science, 1 Fine Art, 0.5 Wellness, and 3.5 additional.

## Advanced Placement

29 Advanced Placement courses are available in the following areas: Economics, Government, Physics I \& II, Physics C, Psychology, English Literature/ Composition, Calculus AB and BC, Statistics, Biology, Chemistry, US History, European History, Computer Science A,
Environmental Science, Human Geography, Latin, Studio Art, Spanish, French, Chinese, and Music Theory.

## Honors

## Graduation Distinction:

The class of 2019 had 35 graduates with Summa Cum Laude distinction (GPA of 4.0 or higher), 22 Magna Cum Laude distinction (GPA of 3.9-3.9999), and 29 Cum Laude distinction (GPA of 3.8-3.89999).

## AP Scholar Designation:

In the 2019 Advanced Placement exam season, 335 students took a total of 606 exams. Thornton had 33 AP Scholars (scores of 3 or higher on three or more AP exams), 24 AP Scholars with Honors (scores of 3 or higher on 4 or more AP exams), 13 AP Scholars with Distinction (scores of 3 or higher on 5 or more AP exams), and 2 National AP Scholars (scores of 4 or higher on 8 or more AP exams).

## Special Curricular Features:

Thornton Academy has articulation agreements with both the University of Maine and the University of New England. The University of Maine agreement is for motivated engineering-bound students who strive to challenge themselves while working to earn advanced placement in college. Students who successfully complete the rigorous STEM sequence may gain admission to the renowned UMaine engineering program with sophomore standing. The humanitiesfocused articulation agreement with the University of New England involves at least 8 Advanced Placement classes in the areas of Math, Science, English, Environmental Science, and Studio Art. Upon successful completion, students may gain admission to the College of Arts and Sciences at UNE with sophomore standing.
